PRO-LIBERTY: This bill removes the enhancement in the law for those who illegally sell

<ul> <li>The private, personal use of cannabis should be legal for all adults.</li> <li>This bill fixes a problem in the law, whereby a user of therapeutic cannabis who sells their cannabis to another person who is not a qualifying patient or caregiver is subject to additional penalties beyond the illegal sale of cannabis. All people who illegally sell cannabis should be subject to the same penalties, whether or not they sell black-market cannabis or regulated therapeutic cannabis.</li> </ul>	NAY ITL

The New Hampshire Liberty Alliance is a non-partisan coalition working to increase individual liberty, and encourage citizen involvement in the legislative process. Bills on the Gold Standard are evaluated based on their effects on, among other things; civil liberties, personal responsibility, property rights, accountability, constitutionality, and taxation. Roll call votes on Gold Standard bills are the foundation for our annual Liberty Rating report card.

## HB 381, exempting firearms and firearm accessories manufactured for in-state use only from the National Firearm Act.

## Judiciary: OTP/A 3-2

ANTI-LIBERTY: This bill, in its original form, allows for guns completely manufactured and used within the state to avoid national firearms laws. The amendment waters down the bill, removing the original bill's language and making the intent to protect firearm manufacturers from tort claims.

- NHLA is opposed to the amended form of this bill and recommends that the Senate oppose the OTP/A recommendation and pass the original bill by an OTP vote.
- A vote to pass the amendment is a vote to kill the original bill and will be considered anti-liberty.
  Prior to being amended, the original bill is carefully written to prevent the commerce clause in the
- United States Constitution from giving the federal government the authority to regulate firearms.
  The amendment removes this language completely, and replaces it with a bill to protect firearm manufacturers from tort lawsuits.
- HB 551, repealing the license to sell pistols and revolvers.

## Judiciary: OTP 3-2

## PRO-LIBERTY: This bill removes the requirement to have a license to sell a pistol or revolver.

- A license should not be required to sell your own property in the United States of America.
- This bill removes an infringement on a person's gun ownership rights, which are protected under Article 2-a of the NH Constitution and the Second Amendment of the United States Constitution.
